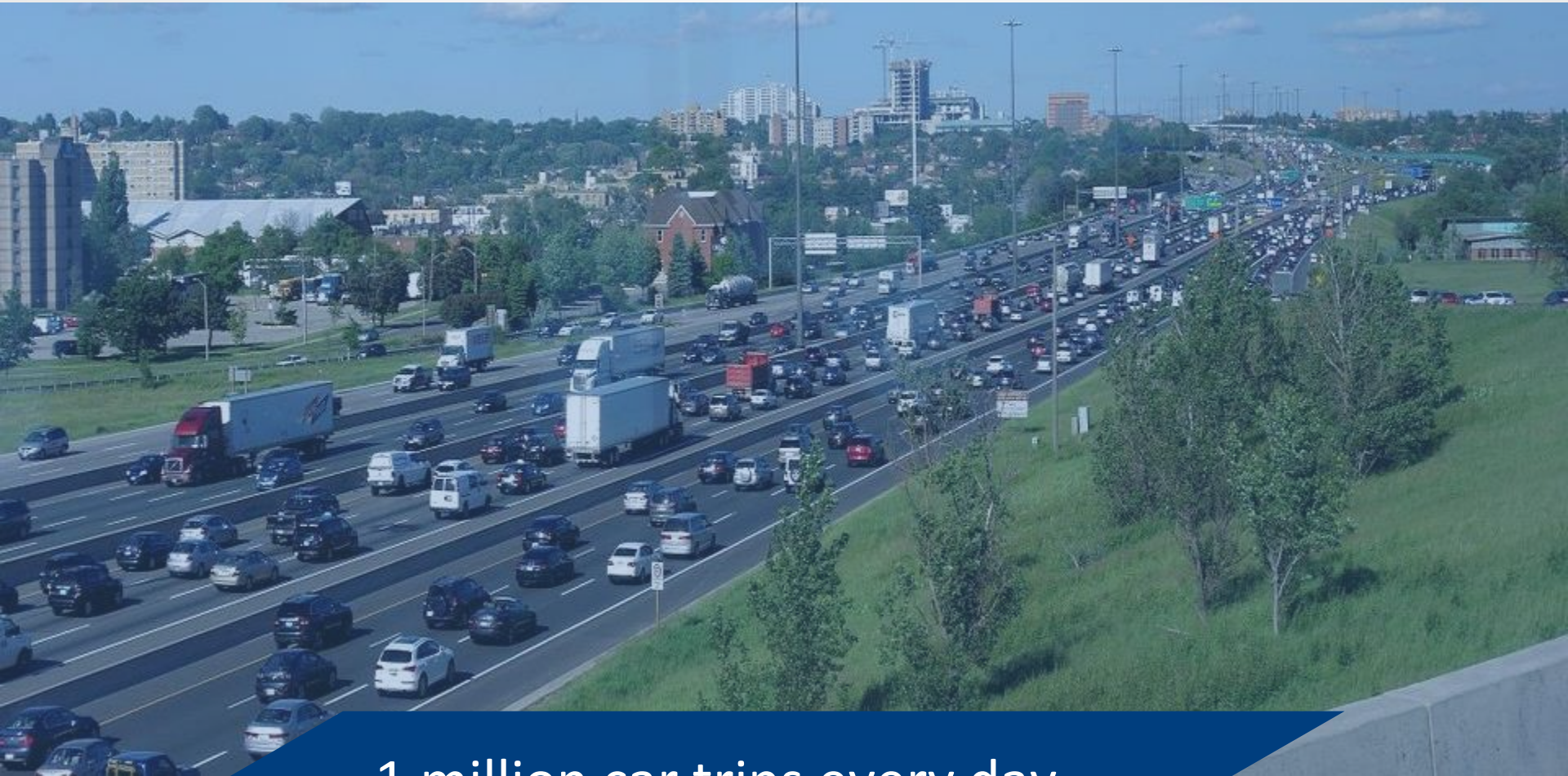
- Value of goods shipped by air through Toronto Pearson:
