


### **The Bad News**

- Uncertainty = Anxiety
- Trump Administration objectives
- Objectives are clear but proposals are incongruent
- Anti-trade sentiment

#### NAFTA Article 2205: Withdrawal

A Party may withdraw from this Agreement six months after it provides written notice of withdrawal to the other Parties. If a Party withdraws, the Agreement shall remain in force for the remaining Parties.

#### • NAFTA 2205 ≠ EU Lisbon treaty

*"I think we'll end up probably terminating NAFTA at some point"*

## Key dates

- Nov 15-21: 5th NAFTA round
- Dec: NAFTA round without Ministerial; Tax vote?
- Jan, Feb & March 2018: NAFTA rounds in Canada, Mexico & USA
- April 2018: President Trump must request extension of Trade Promotion Authority (TPA)
- July 2018: Mexico Presidential elections
- July 2018: TPA due to expire
- November 2018: U.S. Midterm elections
