Compensation costs up 1.2% Jun 2022 to Sep 2022 and up 5.0% over the year ending Sep 2022

Compensation costs increased 1.2 percent for civilian workers, seasonally adjusted, from June 2022 to September 2022. Over the year, total compensation rose 5.0 percent, wages and salaries rose 5.1 percent, and benefit costs rose 4.9 percent. <u>HTML | PDE | RSS | Charts</u>

Total nonfarm payroll employment increased by 263,000 in September, and the unemployment rate edged down to 3.5 percent, the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics reported today. Notable job gains occurred in leisure and hospitality and in health care.




Employment in total nonfarm January 2012–September 2022



Employment in transportation and warehousing January 2012–September 2022



Employment in air transportation January 2012–September 2022




Employment in rail transportation


Employment in water transportation January 2012–September 2022

Employment in truck transportation January 2012–September 2022








Freight trucking -- local

Employment in general freight trucking, long-distance January 2012–August 2022



Employment in couriers and messengers January 2012–September 2022




