

Editor's Note




Dear Readers,

Message from the Outgoing Global WiLAT Chairperson



foundation as one of the three special interest groups of CILT a decade ago as a global forum after Nigeria set up the first WiLAT territory in 2010. By 2019, WiLAT was present in nineteen countries. As I took over the role of Global Chairperson, I set five priorities to steer WiLAT forward by growing members and reach, developing partnerships, driving capacity building and promoting sustainable living as a way of life through our individual and collective actions. Nineteen new territories were inducted to the global family during the past three years and currently WiLAT has spread its wings to thirty-eight countries with over 3300 members. Twenty-two new contacts had been identified. They too will join the network in the coming years once compliance to governance is ascertained. In Ghana, Indonesia and Malaysia WiLAT expanded its footprint to regions by setting up regional WiLAT chapters. WiLAT

also pioneered the entry into the francophone region with the launch of WiLAT Cote d'Ivoire in 2021 and Togo in 2022, to North America with Caribbean islands in 2021. A new region was created for Australasia under a GVC expanding WiLAT regions to nine. Out of the thirty-four countries where CILT is present, WiLAT is yet to be set up in twelve countries. In six of these countries, WiLAT has a contact. North America. Namibia, Cameroon, Hellas, Reunion Islands, Brunei and Azerbaijan are ready to launch WiLAT during the year. Poland will set up WiLAT as a DEI forum within CILT. WiLAT also took the lead to support in the setting up of CILT branches in Turkiye and Namibia and work is in progress in Cote d'Ivoire and Hellas.

WiLAT made good partnerships with Funding Agencies, Trade Associations, Universities and Corporate Partners to support in our efforts locally and globally. In particular, I would like to thank PAIOI, Hoplun, Interport Bangladesh, EFL Global, SAGT, DHL (HongKong) etc., for their generosity and commitment towards WiLAT. Central Asia, Turkiye and Indonesia are leading in developing partnerships. WiLAT's mission is to improve the status of women and capacity building is one of the key priority areas. WiLAT Capacity Building Center (WCBC) was set up virtually in July 2021 to complement the CILT educational offering. This is a compelling membership offering for our women working in the logistics and transport industry worldwide. A skill survey was also conducted to understand the training needs and findings were used to update the programs. The second edition of the CALF program was successfully concluded in hybrid mode with a physical workshop and industry field

visits in Singapore. We have started our focus on the DEI agenda and Hong Kong is leading in this front with a survey and will be exploring certification in the future. WiLAT territories were incentivized to nominate participants and supported member conversions. Language translation facility for multi lingual participants and virtual discussion fora are some of the features that had been added to enhance the learning. To date we have conducted six programs and trained over 200 personnel from 20 countries by an experienced international resource pool.

I am thankful to Vicky Koo, our Head of WCBC, who led this pioneering initiative and her team for a job well done. With Vicky at the helm of Global WiLAT from July 2023, I know WiLAT would be in extremely capable hands for the journey ahead. I wish her all the best during her tenure. WiLAT inspire and impact and as part of our contribution to the society and planet, we have conducted thought leadership webinars on sustainability, tree planting in Sri Lanka, plastic recycling in Nigeria, street clean ups in Indonesia, bicycle donations in Nigeria and Ghana and commemorating earth day and world environment day to create awareness on the climate emergency and call to action to make sustainable living a way of life. Individually I know many are walking the talk and that is what really matters and we have enabled some of these mindset changes.

In WiLAT Global 10th anniversary year, we launched our publication "Spreading our Wings" and developed a video to portray our young WiLAT Global journey. We published a brochure to promote WiLAT. Currently we are present in all the main social media platforms and

have gained traction for our news with an ever-growing followership. WiLAT China introduced a Pod cast series in 2021 to continue their dialogue with membership. Globally we intend to launch our Pod Cast soon, to inspire our membership to keep abreast with industry trends and make them future ready.

Many WiLATs have conducted webinars and conferences individually as well as in partnership with like-minded organizations to promote special days in our event calendar. We also saw heightened engagements with teams locally and regionally. The biannual orientation was introduced for all new joiners. This will enable to bring every one on to the same page. It is important that we all know our mission and how we could create value to our membership.

In order to sustain the growth momentum and to strengthen WiLAT, an assessment was introduced to understand the maturity status by studying the compliance and the impact WiLAT has made in respective territories. This paved the way to understand the gaps, prioritize our focus areas and support territories to reach maturity.

A robust strategic plan was developed with the future in mind and the key focus will be to grow members and reach, develop capacity, strengthen governance, improve visibility and strengthen succession planning. The first edition of Stars of WiLAT (SoW) program, which was launched in 2022, saw ten future leaders being recognized at the CILT International convention in Perth. SoW will be an annual recognition in our WiLAT calendar. The nominations have been called for this year for the second edition with

awardees being recognized at the next year's international convention. As CILT International President mentioned, "I quickly recognized that WiLAT is akin to a force of nature almost something to wonder at, a beacon of light shining and always impossible to ignore" and it is an acknowledgement that WiLAT has made a difference to our industry. Today WiLAT has an advisory role in Council of Trustees in recognition of our efforts. WiLAT also have been allocated two positions in the International Education Steering Committee (IESC).

Our members are influential leaders in their respective countries and have made a mark locally, regionally and globally living our values to inspire and make an impact. WiLATs have demonstrated our pro-activeness, resilience and agility through our work. I am thankful to each and every one for the immense contribution in the past three years to spread our wings and make a difference.

Lets keep our focus with a purpose, persistence and passion to drive greater progress for the next ten years and beyond.

Wings flutter; headwinds are encountered; yet we fly in formation with determination and focus. The destination we seek is sweeter for all of us. All the best WiLAT. We are stronger together!

Rwanda takes major leap towards an air cargo hub


RwandAir's cargo division is on a mission to transform its operations following a partnership with Qatar Airways, but opening Africa's huge market is where the real benefits lie. The two airlines are positioning Kigali, the Rwandan capital, as a regional cargo hub. The new arrangement started early May with Qatar flying a 777F aircraft from Doha to Kigali, twice a week with a scheduled onward service to Entebbe, Nairobi and Liège then back to Doha via either Oslo or Lyon. RwandAir has seen cargo uplift rise by 25% over the last five years and the new freight hub will help tap into the export and import markets around Africa and strengthen links with key overseas markets.

IIATA's One Record finally starts to fly despite vagaries

IATA's One Record finally appears to be gaining traction, after years of "ballyhoo" and "mess". Yesterday Cainiao Network, Alibaba's logistics arm, said it had successfully trialed the "full-chain cargo data exchange" on a flight from Hangzhou to Liege, while Champ Cargosystems and Lufthansa Cargo said they would begin collaborating on making One Record work. Cainiao said it had achieved "several breakthroughs": the first application of RFID technology automatically, and in real-time, pushes the cargo status of shipments to One Record. It also did it simultaneously at both ends of the route, and said it was the first to transmit key node data for singe pieces of cargo. Cainiao said trials integrating RFID into One Record enhanced end-to-end visualisation and transparency of air cargo shipments.





Guangzhou port to invest \$284m in Nansha

Guangzhou Port announced in mid-May that it will invest nearly \$284m to develop a shipping and port complex in its sub-port, Nansha, to offer container leasing, stevedoring, forwarding and other port services. The fifth-busiest container port globally is optimistic about future growth, after throughput in the first four months of 2023 grew 3% year-on-year to 7.3m teu. To occupy a 76,000-square metre area, the complex will be situated on the northwest side of Nansha's Phase III container terminal in Longxue island. To the north of the complex are Nansha's Phase I and Phase II container terminals, and the south side is near Nansha's general cargo terminal. The multi-storey complex will have an area of 250,000 square metres and comprise office and residential units for shipping and logistics companies operating in the Nansha area. Construction is expected to take three years.

India's 3PLs move into airfreight as market takes off

Air cargo seems to have become the newfound investment allure for Indian 3PLs looking to diversify beyond their long-time mainstay trucking verticals. That evolving trend comes as freighter capacity out of India is expanding at a rapid pace. The latest air network addition comes from container line-airline CMA CGM Air Cargo, which has started four services a week on an A330F between Mumbai and Paris. Meanwhile, Delhi-based traditional road transporter Continental Carriers has boosted its industry profile with an "RA-3 accredited" green-field Air Freight Station (AFS) at Kapashera, on the outskirts of Delhi Airport, which it claimed is a first in that off-site category in the country. RA-3, or regulated agent third country validation has been a prerequisite for air cargo shipped into the EU since 2014, following heightened risk perceptions.



Carriers look for trade mix to stay in the black

Ocean carriers with the greatest exposure to the embattled east – west trades recorded the steepest fall in their average freight rates in the first quarter and are struggling to breakeven in the soft market environment. According to an Alphaliner analysis, Hapag-Lloyd tops the table so far, of carriers that publish their results in detail, with an average rate for the 2.84m teu that it transported in Q1 of \$1,999 per teu. This represents a 27.9% decline in the German carrier's average rate, compared to the first quarter of 2022, from 5% less volume. Japanese carrier ONE is second in the rankings with an average rate of \$1,788 per teu, 39.9% lower than last year and from 8.5% fewer carryings.

Shippers hold back on contracts amid uncertainty and ample capacity

A hazy outlook on how the market is going to develop, combined with currently ample ocean capacity, is causing shippers as well as logistics providers to postpone capacity commitments for the time being, according to executives of Seko Logistics. Seko CEO James Gagne described the current atmosphere in the market with the acronym VUCA – volatility, uncertainty, complexity and ambiguity – which has gained currency in recent months. There is little visibility into where the market is going, while it remains vulnerable to disruption. Recent macroeconomic trends have added to the uncertainty. After a spell in which it seemed that interest rate hikes had come to an end, at least for a while, recent warnings that there could be another one or two increases later this year threaten to dampen demand, Mr Gagne noted.

Container freight rates continue to slide on most Indian trades

There seems to be no real let-up in the rate slide seen on most of the trade routes out of India as trade volume pressure continues, according to the latest market analysis by Container News. On the westbound India-Europe trade, average contract rates from West India [Jawaharlal Nehru Port (JNPT)/Nhava Sheva or Mundra Port] to Felixstowe/ London Gateway (UK) or Rotterdam (the Netherlands) have dropped to US\$650 per TEU and US\$700 per FEU, from US\$850 and US\$950, respectively, at the end of April. For West India-Genoa (the West Mediterranean) shipments, contract rates have fallen to US\$700/20' ft container and US\$800/40 ft container, versus US\$850 and US\$950, respectively, a month ago. Eastbound cargo (imports into India) rates for these port pairings have seen further declines, albeit at a slower pace, month-on-month.


The vigorous evolution in the supply chain environment had urged logistics service providers (LSP) to be more creative and innovative in managing their logistics processes. Innovation in logistics is critical to encounter uncertainty, boosting the country's trade competitiveness and meant for business sustainability. Persistent improvement in LSP performance toward acceleration of cost-effective structure and gained profitability to sustain customer satisfaction.

The innovation definition should be comprehensive namely "innovation in logistics", "logistical innovation", and "logistics innovation". In the LSPs organization, innovation in logistics could happen through logistics operations or in other activities along the supply chain. The complexity of the logistics system and differences in a school of thought may encounter miscommunication during the logistics processes. The LSP experience, knowledge, and skills will contribute to the success of LSP accomplishment in their logistics activities. Therefore, vital for LSP to invest in capacity building for talent development. In addition, strengthens LSP multi-skill expertise for reputable relationships in business collaboration.

Logistics management is part of Supply Chain Management (SCM) that plans, implements, and controls the efficient, effective forward & reverse flow & storage of goods, services & related information between the point of origin & the point of consumption to meet customers' requirements." Synchronization of product or goods movement will be emphasized on the Seven Rights (7Rs); the right customer, product, time, place,

condition, quantity, and cost. Henceforth, firms in the supply chain must be prominent in developing an intense connection with their customer for successful logistics outsourcing.

The evolution of SCM, since the 1960s toward digitalization from 2010s onward. Thus, the priority is on emphasizing automated solutions, blockchain technology, the Internet of Things (IOT), real-time big data, instant information exchange, and enhancement of other technologies usage.

A Momentarily View on Halal Logistics (HL)


The logistics industry is the pillar of the country's economic growth for business sustainability. The most important logistics skills are customer service, transportation, and warehousing management. Hence, embarking on the knowledge of HL is an important agenda for Halal industry stakeholders. The general logistics basic concept is similar compared to HL, that is "a process of planning, implementing, and managing the efficient, seamless flow and storage of Halal Certified products (raw materials, semi-finished or finished good) from the origin to the final consumption ensuring full Syariah compliance." Certified Malaysia Halal Logistics Standard: MS2400-1-2010 Distribution, MS2400-2-2010 Warehousing & MS2400-3-2010 Retailing. Additionally, crucial to avoid contamination by segregation or separation of Halal cargo from Non-Halal cargo in SCM.

The halal industry in Malaysia can be categorized into five (5) areas:

- Food Products: Livestock, Processed Food & Beverages, Food Retailing.
- b. Pharmaceutical, Cosmetic and Personal Care: OTC, Drugs/ Vaccines.
- Additives & Ingredients: Food Products, Non-Food Products.
- d. Lifestyle: Apparel, Restaurant & Hotels.
- e. Services: Logistics Standard, Auditing & Certification, Research, and Technology Development.

A RECAP ON THE CILT AFRICA FORUM 2023

A significant continental conference, the Chartered Institute of Logistics and Transport (CILT) AFRICA Forum provides a forum for governments, corporate entities, individuals, students, and other participants in the transport and logistics industry to exchange knowledge, advance professional and commercial interests, and learn from one another.

The Chartered Institute of Logistics and Transport (CILT) Rwanda hosted the annual Africa Forum from April 24–27, 2023, at the Kigali Centre in Rwanda. The event brought together seasoned professionals from academia and the logistics, transport, and supply chain industries for an engaging four days of learning, networking, and discussions.

The conference featured the delivery of numerous papers and discourses covering current issues within the industry, focusing on the successful implementation of the Africa Continental Free Trade Area (AfCFTA). The forum's theme was "Logistics: The Engine for Sustainable Implementation of AfCFTA."

High profile key speakers and well-known members of the industry participated in the discussion, which centered on the following main topics:

- Contemporary issues in global supply chains and opportunities for sustainable implementation of Africa Continental Free Trade Area. (Plenary session).
- Modus Operandi of Africa Continental Free Trade Area: The role of logistics and transport business community in effective implementation of AfCFTA. (Plenary session).
- The role of women in building resilient logistics and transport systems behind the successful implementation of Africa Continental Free Trade Area (WiLAT Session).
- Leveraging technology to build resilient logistics and transport systems to drive the implementation of Africa Continental Free Trade Area. (NextGen)

Teete OWUSU-NORTEY, FCILT, established the annual award for the Next Generation forum in memory of his mentor and friend Cyril Bleadsdale, OBE, FCILT. The award was then presented at the 2023 CILT Africa Forum Dinner in Kigali, Rwanda in April 2023.

Chief Teete, who has worked with the Next Generation forum for many years, noticed that there isn't enough coaching and mentoring going on there to help members achieve their professional goals. The creation of the NGAA award program and the selection of a local and international mentor and coach for the award recipient were sparked by this.

The NGAA award aims to inspire and challenge award winners, runners-up and applicants to strive for outstanding achievements in the logistics, supply chain and transport sector. Umar Balarabe Wambai from Nigeria was chosen as the winner after a rigorous selection process. Congratulations to Umar for his continued success in driving forward positive contributions to the industry.

The forum, which attracted over 700 delegates from 17 nations, offered a welcome chance for collaboration and the achievement of the event's overarching goals, which included developing resilient continental supply chains, logistics, and transportation systems that can withstand emerging global shocks on supply chain networks and continue moving goods and services along with the information they are associated with from one African country to another where they add more value.

Dr. Lou is a Senior Lecturer in Supply Chain and Logistics at the Victoria University (VU) Business School, Specialization Advisor in Supply Chain and Logistics **Undergraduate Course and** Research Leader for Business at the Institute for Sustainable Industries and Liveable Cities and College of Arts, Business, Law, Education and IT at Victoria University. During her PhD study (Supply Chain Optimization), she was awarded the International Student of the Year - Postgraduate by Victoria State in 2013 and has since been awarded the VU Outstanding Student Alumni Award 2015. Dr. Lou was awarded the Entrepreneur Scholarship Award, Behind Closed **Doors and Australian Government** in 2017, Young Professional of the Year award by the Chartered Institute of Logistics and Transport in Australia (CILTA) in 2018 and the VUBS Award for Excellence in Research (Individual - Early Career), Victoria University in 2021. Q1. Reading your profile, I recognize that you have been a shining star throughout, both in academics and in your career. Would you brief us on your rewarding journey thus far and what made you choose a career in academia?

It has been a pleasant journey in the academic area and I have enjoyed working with various industries in the Supply Chain, Transport and Logistics sectors - it has been a natural destiny for me. As an academic, I actively engage in students' learning and teaching support course design, development, delivery and undertaking research.
