Air Canada Cargo opens new cold chain facility at Heathrow Airport

Air Canada Cargo has opened a new cold chain facility at London Heathrow, its largest European hub, to better serve its customers shipping temperature-sensitive cargo. In August 2024, Canada's major and select small airports recorded a total of 547,516 aircraft movements, up 2.8% from August 2023. Itinerant movements (+0.6%) recorded a slight year-over-year increase in August 2024 to 394,326, while local movements rose 9.1% to 153,190. At the same time, major Canadian airlines flew 8.5 million passengers on scheduled and charter services in August 2024, with a passenger load factor of 88.9%.

Screened passenger traffic at Canadian airports, September 2024

In September 2024, 4.8 million passengers passed through pre-board security screening at checkpoints operated at Canada's eight largest airports, an increase of 2.2% from September 2023 and 3.6% higher than the pre-COVID-19 pandemic level in September 2019. The number of passengers screened for domestic flights in September was down 5.2% year over year, as all of Canada's eight largest airports posted declines. However, total domestic screened passenger counts were 1.3% above pre-pandemic levels in September 2019. In September 2024, the number of transborder (to the United States) screened passengers was up 12.2% over the same month in 2023 and it exceeded pre-pandemic levels from September 2019 by 5.6%. International screened passenger traffic (outside of the United States) in September 2024 was 7.0% higher than in the same month in 2023 and was 5.9% higher than in September 2019.

Justice Department and Department of Transportation Launch Broad Public Inquiry into the State of Competition in Air Travel

On October 24, 2024, the Justice Department's Antitrust Division and the Department of Transportation jointly announced a broad public inquiry into the state of competition in air travel. The agencies are seeking public information on consolidation, anticompetitive conduct, and a wide range of issues affecting the availability and affordability of air travel options. The topics covered in the agencies' joint Request for Information (RFI) include previous airline mergers, exclusionary conduct, airport access, aircraft manufacturing, airline ticket sales, pricing, and rewards practices, and the experiences of aviation workers.

IATA to Offer Digital Currencies in Financial Settlement Systems

The International Air Transport Association (IATA) announced that it will offer digital currencies in the financial settlement systems it operates for the aviation industry. "Digitalization impacts many aspects of our daily lives, including the currency we use. With the increasing use of digital currencies, it is imperative that IATA's industry financial settlement systems adapt to support the needs of those using our services," said Muhammad Albakri, IATA's Senior Vice President for Financial Settlement and Distribution Services. The first digital currency to be offered is the digital Renminbi, which will be available in the China Billing and Settlement Plan (BSP) by the end of

2024. "China is one of the most advanced countries in the world in the adoption of digital currency. Recognizing the trend, IATA's China Airline Committee requested for the digital Renminbi to be included in the BSP. This is an important development and IATA will accommodate the digital Renminbi by year-end," said Albakri.

Port Authority of New York and New Jersey airports soar through September, setting new monthly record

The Port Authority of New York and New Jersey today announced that its commercial airports are flying high into the record books with their busiest September of all time, on track for their busiest year ever. The PATH commuter rail system recorded its busiest month since February 2020, marking new post-pandemic highs for total monthly riders and average weekday riders. At the Port of New York and New Jersey, September 2024 marked the second-busiest September in the port's history, behind only the record volumes experienced during the pandemic-related cargo surge in 2022. The port also maintained its position as the nation's second-busiest gateway for loaded cargo yearto-date. The Port Authority's vehicular crossings maintained strong levels matching pre-pandemic vehicular volumes. The Port Authority's airports are on track to break the air passenger record set in 2023 for busiest year of all time. From January through September, about 109.7 million passengers used the agency's airports. This was a jump of about 1.5 million passengers over the same period of 2023. Passenger volumes decreased 11 percent from August 2024, marking the end of the traditional summer travel season.

The International Air Transport Association (IATA) released data for September 2024 global passenger demand with the following highlights: 1. *Total demand*, measured in revenue passenger kilometers (RPK), was up 7.1% compared to September 2023, an all-time high for September. Total capacity, measured in available seat kilometers (ASK), was up 5.8% year-on-year. The September load factor was 83.6% (+1.0ppt compared to September 2023). 2. *International demand* rose 9.2% compared to September 2023. Capacity was up 9.1% year-on-year and the load factor rose to 83.8% (+0.1ppt compared to September 2023). 3. *Domestic demand* rose 3.7% compared to September 2023. Capacity was up 0.7% year-on-year and the load factor was 83.3% (+2.4ppt compared to September 2023).

September Saw 9.4% Growth for Air Cargo

The International Air Transport Association (IATA) released data for September 2024 global air cargo markets showing continuing strong annual growth in demand. 1. Total demand, measured in cargo tonnekilometers (CTKs), rose by 9.4% compared to September 2023 levels (10.5% for international operations) for a 14th consecutive month of growth. 2. Capacity, measured in available cargo tonne-kilometers (ACTKs), increased by 6.4% compared to September 2023 (8.1% for international operations). This continued to be largely related to the growth in international belly capacity, which rose 10.3%--extending the trend of double-digit annual capacity growth to 41 consecutive months. "September performance brought continued good news for air cargo markets. With 9.4% year-on-year growth, cargo volumes continued to mark all-time highs for demand. Yields are also improving, up 11.7% on 2023 and 50% above 2019 levels. All this points to a strong finish for this year. For longer-term trends, the air cargo world will be closely following the outcome of the US election for indications of how US trade policy will evolve," said Willie Walsh, IATA's Director General. Union files for conciliator to help in negotiations with CPKC

Unifor has filed for conciliation in its negotiations with Canadian Pacific Kansas City (CPKC) after discussions have reached an impasse between the two parties over key issues. "This is a crucial moment for our members at CPKC, who deserve meaningful progress on the issues that matter most," said Unifor national president Lana Payne. "We entered bargaining ready to address the persistent challenges our members face, but the employer's lack of urgency has left us with no choice but to seek assistance through the conciliation process." Negotiations began with CPKC to address issues such as work ownership, job security and labour relations the union says have severely impacted the working environment.


U.S. rail traffic for the week ending Oct. 26, 2024 (Week 43) came in at 519,415 carloads and intermodal units, up 4.2% from the same week last year, for this week, total U.S. weekly rail traffic was 519,415 carloads and intermodal units. Total carloads for the week ending October 26 were 228,829 carloads, up 0.9 percent compared with the same week in 2023, while U.S. weekly intermodal volume was 290,586 containers and trailers, up 6.9 percent compared to 2023. Seven of the 10 carload commodity groups posted an increase compared with the same week in 2023. They included motor vehicles and parts, up 2,408 carloads, to 16,444; chemicals, up 1,506 carloads, to 32,838; and farm products excl. grain, and food, up 1,308 carloads, to 18,091.

Commodity groups that posted decreases compared with the same week in 2023 were coal, down 3,132 carloads, to 59,981; metallic ores and metals, down 2,341 carloads, to 18,085; and nonmetallic minerals, down 332 carloads, to 32,084. Canadian railroads reported 97,007 carloads for the week, up 0.7 percent, and 71,773 intermodal units, up 2.0 percent compared with the same week in 2023. For the first 43 weeks of 2024, Canadian railroads reported cumulative rail traffic volume of 6,846,120 carloads, containers and trailers, down 0.0 percent.

FRA proposes to amend Safety Technology Regulations to establish strict safety standards while enabling railroad operations

The U.S. Department of Transportation's Federal Railroad Administration (FRA) on October 25, 2024 published a notice of proposed rulemaking (NPRM) proposing to amend certain regulations on positive train control (PTC) systems. PTC technology is designed to prevent train-to-train collisions, over-speed derailments, incursions into established work zones, and movements of trains through switches left in the wrong position. This NPRM seeks to improve the efficiency and safety of railroad operations by standardizing regulations concerning railroad operations when PTC systems are not enabled, which can occur due to a PTC outage or when PTC systems are temporarily disabled to facilitate maintenance, repairs, or upgrades to railroad infrastructure.

The Association of American Railroads (AAR) today released the "Rail Jobs Report: The Value and Opportunities in Railroading," which provides a comprehensive review of the benefits and opportunities that come with freight rail careers. Featuring various employee testimonials, the report spotlights railroaders throughout the industry with stories of advancement, family legacy and career impact. The jobs report features statistics that distinguish freight rail jobs from those across other industries, highlighting railroading's strong wages, worldclass benefits and hundreds of career paths and advancement opportunities: Key findings were: 1. The median tenure of railroad employees is 13 years (compared to 3.9 years for other private sector workers). 2. The average Class I railroad employee's annual pay and benefit package is valued from \$135,000 to almost \$190,000. 3. Effective Jan. 1, 2025, unionized freight rail employees' monthly health care premiums will decrease by more than 10%, from \$309.21 to \$277.54 (compared to the national average monthly premium of more than \$500 for employer-provided family coverage). 4. MEA concerned about new strike notice from Montreal longshoremen

The Maritime Employers Association (MEA) has issued a statement in response to a 24-hour strike notice from the Port of Montreal Longshoremen's Union, CUPE Local 375, set to begin on Sunday, Oct.27, at 7:00 a.m. The strike will affect all work on Port of Montreal grounds, including the Contrecœur terminal. This follows a <u>series of strikes and pressure tactics that have disrupted port operations, including a recent overtime ban imposed by the union on Oct.10, 2024.</u> MEA highlighted that these disruptions have compounded existing operational challenges, impacting the Quebec and Canadian supply chains and resulting in a notable <u>24% decline in cargo handled at the port since 2022</u>, with many clients redirecting shipments to U.S. East Coast ports. Labor Minister Steven MacKinnon previously proposed appointing a special mediator to restart negotiations between the MEA and CUPE Local 375 without pressure tactics. However, the proposal

was withdrawn when both parties failed to agree on the mediator appointment.

Master contract discussions to resume in November for U.S. port workers

In a joint statement, the International Longshoremen's Association (ILA) and United States Maritime Alliance (USMX) said they will resume master contract discussions in November 2024 to discuss all outstanding issues to reach a new agreement. The two sides released the statement Oct. 3, 2024 saying they had reached an agreement on wages and have agreed to extend the master contract until Jan. 15, 2025, and will return to the bargaining table to negotiate all other outstanding issues. "Effective immediately, all current job actions will cease and all work covered by the master contract will resume," the Oct. 3 statement read.

Montreal dockworkers target MSC's terminals for strike this week

Two marine terminals handling Mediterranean Shipping Co.'s Montreal container services face a work stoppage starting this week after longshore workers there voted to authorize an indefinite strike targeting nearly half of the port's container capacity. Termont International said on October 28, 2024 that Local 375 of the Canadian Union of Public Employees (CUPE) notified it that an "unlimited strike" will occur at Montreal's Maisonneuve and Viau terminals starting Thursday at 11 AM local time. The terminal operator urged shippers with cargo at both terminals to schedule pickups by Wednesday, October 30, 2024 evening. The strike at the two terminals will idle more than 1 million TEUs.

With the two sides unable to reach a new agreement, the Maritime Employers Association (MEA) has asked Canada's Minister of Labour and Seniors to appoint a special mediator so an agreement can be reached by Dec. 3 2024. This comes as CUPE 375, the union representing Port of Montreal longshore workers, issued a strike notice Oct. 28, 2024 for workers at the Termont corporation terminals. The union has targeted Termont because it says it is the only company at the Port of Montreal to modify schedules in a punitive way.

In a new pressure tactic in a series of partial work stoppages, the union representing 1,200 longshoremen at the Port of Montreal on October 31, 2024 began an "unlimited strike" uniquely targeting Termont, which operates two terminals accounting for 40% of container cargo at Canada's second biggest container port after Vancouver. While all other terminals remain operational, the Port of Montreal expressed "its deep concern about the negative repercussions of this work stoppage." As was the case of a three-day work stoppage earlier this month, the job action will affect Termont's Viau and Maisonneuve terminals that employ some 300 dockers notably handling substantial contractual business with Mediterranean Shipping Company. This follows a 24hour industrial action staged last Sunday by Local 375 of the CUPE union. There has also been an ongoing boycott of overtime work since October 10. With substantial container handling capacity paralyzed by this work stoppage, ships and trains are already obliged to choose other routes, the Montreal Port Authority (MPA) stated.

Record 2024 cruise season wraps at Port of Vancouver

The final cruise ship of the 2024 season, *Norwegian Jewel*, will depart from Canada Place tomorrow—marking the end of another successful year for Vancouver's cruise industry. The award-winning Canada Place terminal at the Port of Vancouver is expected to welcome 327 cruise ship visits and 1.32 million passengers between March 11 and October 29, 2024—breaking the previous record for passengers set last year by more than 80,000 (a 7% year-on-year increase). "We want to thank everyone who helped 2024 be such a successful cruise season in Vancouver—to have back-to-back record years run so smoothly is a huge accomplishment and testament to the dedication of those involved," said Shri Madiwal, Vice President of Operations and Supply Chain at the Vancouver Fraser Port Authority, the federal agency that enables growing trade through the Port of Vancouver, including cruise, while protecting the environment.

Cargo-ship owner to pay US \$102 million over Baltimore bridge collapse, DOJ says

The owner and operator of the cargo ship that struck Baltimore's Francis Scott Key Bridge in March, killing six people, have agreed to pay \$102 million to the federal government, the U.S. Justice Department said on October 24, 2024. The department in September filed a civil claim seeking \$103 million from two Singaporean companies, Grace Ocean Private Limited and Synergy Marine Private Limited. The claim was intended to recoup the money the U.S. government spent responding to the disaster and clearing the wreck of

the Dali ship and bridge debris from the Port of Baltimore so the waterway could reopen in June. Principal Deputy Associate Attorney General Benjamin Mizer said the settlement "ensures that the costs of the federal government's cleanup efforts in the Fort McHenry Channel are borne by Grace Ocean and Synergy and not the American taxpaver."

Offshore project delivers Virginia cargo windfall

Progress on a gigantic wind farm off the US mid-Atlantic coast is picking up speed, and it's driving a surge of project cargo to the Port of Virginia. In the first nine months of 2024, breakbulk cargo volumes through the port shot up 372% year over year to 360,976 tons, according to the Virginia Port Authority (VPA). The cargo windfall is largely coming from the 2.6-gigawatt Coastal Virginia Offshore Wind project, which Virginia utility Dominion Energy is developing in the mid-Atlantic, about 27 miles off the coast of Virginia Beach, VPA spokesman Joe Harris told the *Journal of Commerce*.

Port Houston continues to shatter records, in September 2024 surpassing three million twenty-foot equivalent units (TEUs) faster than ever before. Port Houston has recorded 3,120,589 TEUs so far this year, a 10% increase compared to the same period in 2023. Loaded imports were up 4% for the month of September 2024 and 8% year-to-date. Loaded exports, although down 8% for September 2024, are up 10% year-to-date primarily due to continued demand for resins. Total container volume for the month of September was 329,462 TEUs, an increase of 1% compared to September 2023.

U.S. shippers are steering clear of East and Gulf Coast ports amid worries the 45,000 dockworkers at those trade hubs will go on strike again if their union leader does not land a new contract with employers

by a Jan. 15 deadline. The International Longshoremen's Association (ILA) labor union and the United States Maritime Alliance (USMX) employer group had ended a three-day strike in October with a tentative agreement on wages, but left the thorny issue of port automation still to be resolved. "Anything we expect that we need in the back half of January, we're effectively diverting to the West Coast," said Chris Peterson, CEO of Graco high chair and Crock-Pot cooker maker Newell Brands, referring to the period after the new contract negotiating deadline.

Higher ocean freight rates and container volumes helped drive a 41% gain in ocean shipping revenue for A.P. Moller-Maersk in the 2024 third quarter. The Denmark-based parent (CPH: MAERSK-B.CO) of Maersk shipping line and APM Terminals said the strong quarter along with a robust container market and continued disruptions to Red Sea shipping led it to upgrade its full-year 2024 guidance from Oct. 21 of underlying earnings before interest and taxes to \$5.2 billion-\$5.7 billion from \$3 billion-\$5 billion.

The Canadian Trucking Alliance had the opportunity to be part of a panel discussion on October 24, 2024 at the inaugural Canadian Policy Forum of the Global Cold Chain Alliance in Ottawa. Front and centre in the discussions was the need to address Driver Inc – and that it will be up to responsible supply chain partners to get the job done, said Geoff Wood, Sr. VP, Policy, CTA. "And it's even more vital that all supply chain partners do their part to stop funding the practice."

Regulatory uncertainties loom over trucking industry as U.S. election approaches: TCA

With the upcoming U.S. presidential election, trucking industry stakeholders are bracing for potential regulatory changes that could reshape the sector, according to Dave Heller, senior vice-president of safety and government affairs at the Truckload Carriers Association (TCA). Speaking at the Fleet Safety Council conference in Brampton, Ont., he outlined concerns over the adoption timeline for battery-electric vehicles (BEVs), delays in speed limiter regulations, and unresolved issues around safety fitness determinations and minimum liability insurance — all of which could be influenced by the election outcome.

On October 25, 2024, the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister of Fisheries, Oceans and the Canadian Coast Guard and Member of Parliament of Cape Breton—Canso, Mike Kelloway, on behalf of the President of the Treasury Board and Minister of Transport, the Honourable Anita Anand, announced up to \$22.5 million for EverWind Fuels.
